

## Electric Service Rule No. 14 Shortage of Supply & Interruption of Delivery

## A. Shortage of Supply

- Shortages of supply of electric energy for the District's system may occur from causes beyond the District's reasonable control, and the District does not guarantee continuity or sufficiency of supply of electric energy.
- 2. The District shall not be liable for any shortage or insufficiency of supply of electric energy, or any loss or damage of any kind or character occasioned thereby, caused by strikes or labor disputes, fire, or other casualty, governmental restrictions, regulations, orders, or controls, terrorism, or sabotage, civil commotion, or riots, war or hostile governmental action, wind, rain, lightning, earthquake, or other acts of God, or any other cause beyond the District's reasonable control.
- 3. During the period of any shortage of supply of electric energy for its system, the District will apportion the available supply of energy among all its customers in the manner which the District determines to be most fair and reasonable.

## **B.** Interruption of Delivery

- Whenever the District shall find it necessary to make repairs or improvements to its system, it shall have the right to temporarily suspend delivery of electric energy. Notice will be given if circumstances reasonably permit. Repairs or improvements will be made as rapidly as practicable and, if practicable, they will be made at such times as will produce the least inconvenience to customers.
- 2. The District shall not be liable for interruption of supply of electric energy, or any loss or damage of any kind or character occasioned thereby, caused by strikes, or labor disputes, fire or other casualty, governmental restrictions, regulations, orders or controls, terrorism or sabotage, civil commotion or riots, war or hostile governmental action, wind, rain, lightning, earthquake or other acts of God, or any other cause beyond the District's reasonable control.
